



# The Secret To Great Faith

**“... verily I say unto you, If ye have faith as a grain of mustard seed, ye shall say unto this mountain, Remove hence to yonder place; and it shall remove; and nothing shall be impossible unto you” (Matthew 17:20).**

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**“But without faith it is impossible to please**

- 1) The centurion sought Jesus' help, through supportive servants. Jesus responded “I will come and heal him”. What a privilege it would have been for Jesus to come into his house. However, we note that great faith sees beyond privileges.
- 2) “Speak the word only”. There is power in spoken words. God created the entire universe by speaking. He creates the fruits of our lips. Hannah got her miracle through the word of Eli. To despise spoken words is to destroy faith and the associated miracles. “Where the word of a king is, there is power...” (Ecclesiastes 8:4).
- 3) “I am a man under authority”. Remaining under authority brings all the benefits of that authority at each moment that they are needed. It is worth noting that great faith is developed by being “under authority”!
- 4) Those who revel in rights and privileges to the neglect of faith will lose them.
- 5) “As thou hast believed” - His faith became the channel for his miracle. **What you believe will either bring your miracle to you, or keep it away from you!**

This study gives the profound revelation that the secret to great faith is living under authority - a great fit for some! It is obvious from scriptures that a mustard seed sized faith when exercised produces mountain sized miracles. The plight for many contemporary Christians is their readiness to settle for less when more is possible. The challenge for all from this message is to grow and exercise our faith for greater possibilities.

**“And when Jesus was entered into Capernaum, there came unto him a centurion, beseeching him, 6 And saying, Lord, my servant lieth at home sick of the palsy, grievously tormented. 7 And Jesus saith unto him, I will come and heal him. 8 The centurion answered and said, Lord, I am not worthy that thou shouldest come under my roof: but speak the word only, and my servant shall be healed. 9 For I am a man under authority, having soldiers under me: and I say to this man, Go, and he goeth; and to another, Come, and he cometh; and to my servant, Do this, and he doeth it. 10 When Jesus heard it, he marvelled, and said to them that followed, Verily I say unto you, I have not found so great faith, no, not in Israel. 11 And I say unto you, That many shall come from the east and west, and shall sit down with Abraham, and Isaac, and Jacob, in the kingdom of heaven. 12 But the children of the kingdom shall be cast out into outer darkness: there shall be weeping and gnashing of teeth. 13 And Jesus said unto the centurion, Go thy way; and as thou hast believed, so be it done unto thee. And his servant was healed in the selfsame hour” (Matthew 8:5-13).**

**“Now when he had ended all his sayings in the audience of the people, he entered into Capernaum. 2 And a certain centurion's servant, who was dear unto him, was sick, and ready to die. 3 And when he heard of Jesus, he sent unto him the elders of the Jews, beseeching him that he would come and heal his servant. 4 And when they came to Jesus, they besought him instantly, saying, That he was worthy for whom he should do this: 5 For he loveth our nation, and he hath built us a synagogue. 6 Then Jesus went with them. And when he was now not far from the house, the centurion sent friends to him, saying unto him, Lord, trouble not thyself: for I am not wor-**
